## **QUESTIONS AND NOTES**

- → Describe to one another the joy you had when you first became a Christian.
- → 6:13-15 The temple is finished
  - In v14 the people continued to build and prosper under preaching
  - Compare that with Eph 4:11-16
  - In what ways might we separate those 3 elements of building the church, under the word and prospering?
  - Compare this dedication with the dedication of Solomon's temple in 1 Kings 8:62-66
  - The temple dedication in Ezra is much smaller. How does that lead us to look forward in the story?
  - Jesus as the true and better temple declared His work finished on the cross. Why does that bring us joy?
- → 6:16-22 Come to the finished temple and find joy
  - What are the reasons that bring the people joy in these verses?
  - How do we find these now in Christ?
  - Why might we lose the joy we first had in these wonderful truths?

- → Summarise and Apply
  - What in this passage leads us to worship Jesus?
  - What do we learn about ourselves from this passage? How does it lead us to give thanks or repent?
  - How might this help us share the good news with our friends and neighbours who don't know Jesus?

## **PRAYER**

#### RESPOND TO GOD IN PRAISE AND PLEADING

Use this prayer from Psalm 16:5-10 to help you structure your prayers. Pray in response to the passage, for yourself, the church and others.

Lord, you alone are my portion and my cup;

you make my lot secure.

The boundary lines have fallen for me in pleasant places;

surely I have a delightful inheritance.

I will praise the Lord, who counsels me;

even at night my heart instructs me.

I keep my eyes always on the Lord.

With him at my right hand, I will not be shaken.

Therefore my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices;

my body also will rest secure,

because you will not abandon me to the realm of the dead,

nor will you let your faithful one see decay
